

Traditionally the stations of the cross is a service which takes place around different parts the church building. The 'stations' are fixed points, usually with an image of Christ's journey to the cross.

This service is for you to read and meditate on either on your own, or as a family group. It is designed for you to take part around your home. It begins at your front door. You could then designate different parts of your home/ garden to conduct the rest of the worship. If that is difficult, then simply follow the service from the comfort of your armchair. Please feel free to engage with this service as you feel appropriate for your setting. You might also like to light a candle which will be extinguished at the end of the service.

THE FIRST STATION

Jesus on the Mount of Olives - Matthew 26:36-41 (NRSV)

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray.' ³⁷He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be grieved and agitated. ³⁸Then he said to them, 'I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me.' ³⁹And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed, 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not what I want but what you want.' ⁴⁰Then he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, 'So, could you not stay awake with me one hour? ⁴¹Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial;* the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.'

THE SECOND STATION

Jesus, betrayed by Judas, Is Arrested - Mark 14:43-46 (NRSV)

⁴³Immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas, one of the twelve, arrived; and with him there was a crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders. ⁴⁴Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying, 'The one I will kiss is the man; arrest him and lead him away under guard.' ⁴⁵So when he came, he went up to him at once and said, 'Rabbi!' and kissed him. ⁴⁶Then they laid hands on him and arrested him.

THE THIRD STATION

Jesus is Condemned by the Sanhedrin - Luke 22:66-71 (NRSV)

When day came, the assembly of the elders of the people, both chief priests and scribes, gathered together, and they brought him to their council. 67They said, 'If you are the Messiah,' tell us.' He replied, 'If I tell you, you will not believe; 68 and if I question you, you will not answer. 69 But from now on the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the power of God.' 70 All of them asked, 'Are you, then, the Son of God?' He said to them, 'You say that I am.' 71Then they said, 'What further testimony do we need? We have heard it ourselves from his own lips!'

Peter Denies Jesus - Matthew 26:69-75 (NRSV)

Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. A servant-girl came to him and said, 'You also were with Jesus the Galilean.' 70But he denied it before all of them, saying, 'I do not know what you are talking about.' 71When he went out to the porch, another servant-girl saw him, and she said to the bystanders, 'This man was with Jesus of Nazareth.'* 72 Again he denied it with an oath, 'I do not know the man.' 73 After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter, 'Certainly you are also one of them, for your accent betrays you.' 74Then he began to curse, and he swore an oath, 'I do not know the man!' At that moment the cock crowed. 75Then Peter remembered what Jesus had said: 'Before the cock crows, you will deny me three times.' And he went out and wept bitterly.

THE **FIFTH** STATION

Jesus is Judged by Pilate - Mark 15:1-5 (NRSV)

As soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council. They bound Jesus, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate. ²Pilate asked him, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' He answered him, 'You say so.' 3Then the chief priests accused him of many things. 4Pilate asked him again, 'Have you no answer? See how many charges they bring against you.' 5But Jesus made no further reply, so that Pilate was amazed. 15So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas for them; and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified.



THE SIXTH STATION

Jesus is Scourged and Crowned with Thorns - John 19:1-3 (NRSV)

Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters,* and they gathered the whole cohort around him. ²⁰They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, ²⁰and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on his head. They put a reed in his right hand and knelt before him and mocked him, saying, 'Hail, King of the Jews!' ³⁰They spat on him, and took the reed and struck him on the head. ³¹After mocking him, they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him.



THE SEVENTH STATION

Jesus Takes Up the Cross - John 19:6, 15-17 (NRSV)

⁶When the chief priests and the police saw him, they shouted, 'Crucify him! Crucify him!' Pilate said to them, 'Take him yourselves and crucify him; I find no case against him.' ¹⁵They cried out, 'Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!' Pilate asked them, 'Shall I crucify your King?' The chief priests answered, 'We have no king but the emperor.' ¹⁶Then he handed him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus; ¹⁷and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew

²⁷A great number of the people followed him, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. ²⁸But Jesus turned to them and said, 'Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. ²⁹For the days are surely coming when they will say, "Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed." ³⁰Then they will begin to say to the mountains, "Fall on us"; and to the hills, "Cover us." ³¹For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?'

Jesus is Crucified-Luke 23:32-34 (NRSV)

³³When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing.

Jesus Dies on the Cross - Luke 23:44-46 (NRSV)



Having said this, he breathed his last.



Jesus is Placed in the Tomb - Matthew 27:57-60 (NRSV)

When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who was also a disciple of Jesus. ⁵⁸He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus; then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. ⁵⁹So Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth ⁶⁰and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock. He then rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb and went away.
